Nuts in Redfern Park?

Two Board members have looked into the possibility of planting nut trees in Redfern Park. The City has approved the planting of up to five nut trees in the park. We have to purchase, plant, water, prune, and then harvest what the squirrels leave us. This proposed project will require a planting party and a committee of stewards to care for the trees.

The trees could be planted in memory of the late Denise Dunn, who was very active with SJNA, and was keenly interested in getting some nut trees planted in our neighbourhood.

We priced out the project on a "Rolls Royce" basis eg the best of everything and came up with a cost of about \$650 for 5 trees (an almond, a walnut and three hazelnut trees) This also includes fertilizer, manure, a stone plaque and 5 planting kits consisting of posts and wires.

Of course it will be up to the members to discuss the matter, make appropriate changes and approve the outcome. ~ Don Startin

The Savory Café 1841 Oak Bay: A little bit of Cheers!


When you first walk into Savory Café, it's pretty clear it's the community hang out: hundreds of pictures of us locals on the wall, the special welcome for dogs.

Welcome to Summer, everyone, a great time to talk about being stewards to the environment we live in, both locally and globally.

Let's appreciate and thank all of the people who help to make our recycling program in the South Jubilee Neighbourhood a success. That includes the coordinators, volunteers and all of the people who take the time to contribute to our monthly recycling day. Without the willingness to make recycling a priority, without everyone's contribution, this program would not be as popular, exciting and successful as it is.

A recent article in the Huff Post about Henderson Island, a remote, South Pacific atoll, documented that it is littered with an estimated 38 million pieces of plastic, giving it the highest density of human-created debris in the world. This is plastic discarded elsewhere on the planet that ends up, via ocean currents, fouling what should be a pristine island.

This leads us back to the 4 R's, those being Reduce, Reuse, Recycle and Re-Fuse! It is impressive but staggering how many large bags of recycling we collect each month. Wine Store Proposed for Save-on-Foods

The Landuse committee met with Save-on-Foods who are proposing the addition of a liquor sales area for BC wines only to their Foul Bay Rd store. Last year Save on Foods bought the BC Wine Guys VQA Wine store at Willows Center on Cadboro Bay Road. It would like to transfer that licence to the Foul Bay store.

Save on Foods currently has 14 stores in BC that have the same format wine store. These stores only retail 100% locally produced BC wines. Currently the selection includes more than 155 wineries and more than 1250 different wines.

A Landuse community meeting will be held prior to the application being made. No date has been set.
