## **Agenda Approved**

Minutes of 2022 Annual General Meeting were circulated/posted online.

### **Chair/Co-Chair Update**

- The Redfern Commons project has been very busy over the past few months.
- Monthly Recycling program continues on; purchased a whiteboard-finish sandwich board for community events with remaining funds from 2022's Get Growing! grant
- Success in applying for grants sizeable ones to complete the red ferns commons project; city grants (base fund grant)
- Over the year we introduced a new website, sent out newsletters, and behind the scenes continued managing SJNA's finances tracking grant spending, professionalizing SJNA's procedures, automating payments for vendors, etc.

## **Treasurer Update**

- Snapshot of year in review: May 1 2022 to April 30 2023
- Review of grants received and spent:
  - Redfern is the biggest source of SJNA expenses
  - Thanks to the Big Wheel Community Foundation donation of \$5000 and month of May fundraiser of 2% of sales of special burger
  - Base grant from City of Victoria

Coordinator grant of \$20,000 was intended to be shared for both North and South Jubilee but NJNA declined in 2022.

Get Growing grant

Recycling income - rates of recycling went down compared to 2022 records

Neighbourhood survey technology costs were included in 2022

Newsletter printing cost - double the cost compared to last year

Ukraine fundraiser - \$535

Trailer insurance, Zoom subscription, etc.

Redfern Commons Volunteer Coordinator

- Other: Shortly after year end, in May 2023 SJNA received a donation from Aryze, the Good City Project, to support Redfern Commons. Mural projects were prior to April 1 2022.

- Other directors at large: Murray nominated Molly Sullivan and Cindy Hughes. Bianca Bodley put her name forward. Ruan Wetselaar put his name forward (also interested in joining CALUC). No other nominations. All members accepted.

- Comment from community member (summary) historically, SJNA has tried encouraging business participation in the board of directors. The only success has been in donations for festivals, but governance support is important as well.

## **Updates from City Council Liaison**

- Update on Property ownership of sundance 4 lots corner where Bank St school is owned by the city. Opposite corner is owned by the City. Playground area is owned by the school district. Once an area is designated a school zone area, the city still owns the property but the school district has management control of it.
- Official community plan has been hurried up and condensed into one engagement program/engagement period (typically 3 engagement periods to public hearing, now done in 1 period). This is planned to roll out late fall and early 2024. Engagement sessions will be market pop-ups and sessions at City Hall. Anyone can attend the sessions that are held. NAs will not be met with individually.
- Due to the changes on Lee and Leighton, Belcher Avenue is being looked at for a traffic assessment.

### **Greening Committee Update**

- Waiting on delivery for wood for construction on the pergola and demonstration beds. Green roof will be planted in the fall
- Launch of Redfern Commons to hopefully coincide with ParkFest (August 20, 2023)

- Urban Forest Info sheets are available as education and activity guides
- 150,000 trees in Victoria 29% of City is currently covered in tree canopy
- Steps 1) start a conversation anyone, any age; activities are well suited to family participation use worksheets and take quizzes available to print and distribute
- Step 2) Map your block mapping your neighbourhood
- Step 3) Rate your block questionnaire, carbon footprint
- Step 4) Envisioning Our Future Vision our future
- Step 5) Action Act on the ground activities and resources in assist participate in how to determine how when and here
- To invite Coolkit to have an info table/present at ParkFest on August 20th
- Community associations can take on this project, teachers in school, etc.
   Treeplanting campaign in SJNA in future; potential for a neighbourhood grant relating to a Coolkit activity.

## **CALUC Update – Presentation from Empresa Developments**

Gail, Roy and Rochelle remain on Land Use Committee currently. Recruiting new members going forward and Gail has offered to provide mentorship as needed. Ruan will join CALUC.

- Wayne Foster Townhouse development Going to the advisory design panel
- 1905 Lee St moving forward after committee of the whole meeting
- No update on on Fort Street development proposal since october 2022
- Presentation from Empresa Properties re: The Turner building 'Turner Site' -Richmond and Fort - North Jubilee; Peter Johannknecht and Biana Bodley presented on design
- Karl Robertson, president of Empresa Properties. Had a meeting with NJNA association.
  - Complex site, with limits on spacing, not able to meet requirements for residential building.
  - In discussions with City, have flagged road improvements along Richmond and Birch
  - Proposing a 6 story with ground level pedestrian zone, surface parking, building with rental residential and commercial on ground level
  - Approx. 50-60 residential units depending on how the unit mix is managed due to shape of the building + ground floor
  - 16 parking stalls, plus car share and generous bike parking; comparable in ratios; will likely require a parking study; additional stalls on site with discussion with office building next door to work together on increasing parking stalls;
  - Is working with traffic consultants working with Amica building developers
  - If the intention is to have a rental residential building, management would be by the property managers?
  - We asked about affordability for renters
- Invited community to share ideas for additional uses for the Plaza with Empresa Properties ideas for placemaking or community project, extra greenspace etc.
