Tree Removal & Replacement by City

Three trees located on City of Victoria property in the South Jubilee neighbourhood have been identified as having conditions that require that the trees be removed, which can't be resolved by pruning. For safety reasons, these trees require removal as part of our ongoing tree removal and replacement program.

The removal work will occur prior to the end of December and will be performed by City arborists or a contractor authorized by the City of Victoria. **Every tree removed is replaced.** The stump of the removed tree will remain in place until a replacement tree is planted. Tree species are selected months in advance.

Remembering Frances Quetton

On October 5, our wonderful neighbour Frances Mary Quetton (née Lee-Jones), passed away at aged 93. An avid cyclist, gardener, reader, baker, marmalade-maker, sewer and watercolour painter, Frances was born at Withington (Manchester),



England. She grew up in Mill Hill, London, obtained her BSc from St. Mary's College, Durham University, then worked from at the Lister Institute, researching tropical disease. In 1961, she married Hugh Quetton and moved to Montreal, becoming a microbiology researcher/lab demonstrator at Sir George Williams University (now Concordia). When she and Hugh retired to Victoria in 1994, she joined the Christ Church Cathedral bellringers and became involved with fundraising for Grandmothers for Africa. She remained a keen cyclist until age 90. Predeceased by Hugh (2014), Frances is fondly remembered by her older sister, children Timothy (Suzy), Kate (David) and Matthew; and six grandchildren. We couldn't have had a better neighbour, driveway partner and friend in Frances. She shared her raspberries, good humour and caring nature with us. We will miss her terribly and we're grateful for the thirteen years of friendship.
